Junior Livestock Rules

Breeding Animal Divisions: (Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine and Jr. Breeding Meat Goats) are open to 4-H and FFA exhibitors from Riverside, Imperial, San Diego, Orange, Los Angeles, San Bernardino and Ventura Counties.

Market Division: are limited to members of Riverside County 4-H clubs, FFA Chapters, Granges, and Open Juniors.

Entries Close: 5:00 p.m., Saturday Sept. 9.

Must be in fair office no later than, Saturday Sept. 9, 2006.

The Junior Department is restricted to members of the Future Farmers of America, who are under the supervision of the Bureau of Agriculture Education, State Department of Education; members of the 4-H Youth groups, who are under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension Service, University of California; Future Homemakers of America, who are under the supervision of the Bureau of Homemaking Education, State Department of Education; members of other recognized junior farm organizations; children who are residing in public correctional institutions for the mentally, physically, or emotionally handicapped; and other children through eighteen years of age.

(Eligibility ceases at the close of the calendar year which the exhibitor becomes 19 years of age). Southern California fair does not allow members under 9 years of age to exhibit large livestock. Junior exhibitors who are in an established junior organization cannot exhibit in Junior Department as an independent junior exhibitor in the same organization that requires exhibits to be a bona-fide project and certified by an instructor, county agent or local leader. County, District and State Fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering junior exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Open juniors must follow all state rules governing open junior and are not eligible after their eighteenth birthday, prior to January 1 of that year. Liability insurance is the responsibility of/at the discretion of the exhibitor. Therefore, it is suggested that junior exhibitors consider taking out a liability policy covering themselves and their exhibits.

UNIFORMS

All FFA, 4-H and Grange members exhibiting livestock must wear the official uniform of their organization while showing or selling their animals. Ring stewards will check for complete organization uniform when member enters show ring.

The official FFA show uniform to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers, in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows shall consist of ankle-length white trousers, white dress shirt (short or long sleeved, t-shirts are not acceptable) with the FFA emblem attached to the left pocket and the official FFA four-in-hand necktie. The official FFA jacket is optional; if worn the shirt emblem is not required. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing.

For the Fair the official 4-H uniform consists of: White or off-white slacks or white or off-white jeans, (ankle length), white tailored blouse/shirt (no knit or T-shirts), long or short sleeved, (no sleeveless) green 4-H collar, or green 4-H tie, and 4-H cap.



For the Fair the Official uniform of the Grange consists of: Blue denim pants; white long or short sleeved, button-front dress shirt; red waist vest with the Grange emblem on the back; black or brown belt with appropriate buckle, and black or brown leather boots (lace-up style preferred)

For Fair the Official Uniform for Open Juniors consists of: White or blue denim pants, white long or short sleeve shirt, belt, and close toed shoes.
