The purpose of the market animal sale for junior exhibitors at the Southern California Fair is to obtain a fair price for animals and to encourage in their project work.

SPECIAL RULES FOR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

1. Only animals that are in the market ready category or Group 1 & 2's.
2. ORDER OF SALE: Small Animals, Large Animals, Supreme Champions and all Champions will be at the middle of sale.
3. Dairy Heifers will be sold as near 2 p.m. as possible.
4. Donated animals will follow end of species.
5. **Scale weight will not be sale weight. Max Pay weight for animals will be as followed:**
 - Beef – 1,350 lbs * Sheep- 140 lbs
 - Swine- 260 lbs * Goats- 115 lbs
6. Additional charge to the seller will be 5% of gross sale for sheep, swine, market goats, poultry, turkeys and rabbits: 4% for Beef and Dairy. This fund will be held in reserve to pay for loss of animals, advertising, beef and pork promotion, etc. Benefit animals to pay 0% rate for type of animal. NOTE: It is now REQUIRED that all exhibitors selling an animal at auction have a certificate of medication signed and turned in with entry before animal may be sold. NO EXCEPTIONS. Any animal declared unfit at the time of slaughter is the responsibility of the seller and not the fair.
7. Each exhibitor may sell 2 animal, EXCEPT: If exhibitor has two Champions, exhibitor must sell both animals.
 - a) If exhibitor has a champion or reserve champion, exhibitor may sell two animals (one is the champion and the other two is from any of the 4 specie groups Beef, Sheep, Swine, & Goats.
 - b) **Livestock sale will be limited to: OVER 9 yrs of age- One Large and One small animal or Two small animals, UNDER 9 yrs of age Two small animals.**
ALL CHAMPIONS MUST SELL
(example: Champion plus one other of a large animal species and one small.)

- c) Sale of Dairy replacement heifer is in addition to the above.
- d) All champion and Reserve Champion animals must be sold.
- e) All exhibitors going through auction must have their picture taken prior to Saturday.
8. All animals will be presented in the auction in a well-groomed condition as shown in class. All exhibitors must wear official uniform of organization they represent when in sale ring. No glitter or other decorations will be allowed on any animal other than the Champions.
9. All animals entering sale ring will be sold if they receive an opening bid of not less than the buy back for that type of animal. Exhibitors who do not wish to sell at the auction must notify the livestock office in writing no later than the following times:
Swine, Sheep, & Goats Thursday, October 12 by 3:00 p.m. Beef Friday, October 13, Noon ALL ANIMALS NOT BEING SOLD MUST BE SCRATCHED BY NOON FRIDAY, OCTOBER 13th.
10. Exhibitor must be present and ready when called to line up for the sale. Unless exhibitor (or representative) contact livestock superintendent prior to being called the exhibitor will forfeit right to sell animal.
11. All animals sold must be fed, watered and haltered until they are loaded out. Halters must be left on animals.
12. All meat producing livestock must be withheld from slaughter at least 21 days after inoculation with biotic.

1. Showmanship classes must be pre-entered and also at fair one day before show. Entries close 5:00 p.m., Saturday September 9, 2006.
2. Showmanship classes will precede market classes except market beef.

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3. Only animals owned, fitted and entered by exhibitor in Junior Department livestock classes are eligible.
 4. Exhibitors will be required to wear official uniform of the organization they represent.
 5. FFA and 4-H exhibitors placing first in more than one class of advanced or senior must notify the livestock office which class they will compete in by 4:00 p.m. Friday, October 13, 2006.
 6. 1st & 2nd place winners in Basic, Junior 4-H, and Novice FFA will advance into next division.
 7. First two award winners in Senior 4-H & Advanced FFA are eligible to advance to Master-showmanship.

Market Beef Scorecard

Group 1: USDA Prime or Choice quality grade and yield Grade 1 or 2 superior and above average conformation and cut ability. PURPLE RIBBON.

Group 2: USDA Prime or Choice quality grade and yield Grade 1, 2 or 3, having average conformation and cut ability. USDA Select+ quality grade and Yield grade 1 or 2 and having superior conformation and cut ability.

Group 3: USDA Prime or Choice quality grade: Yield Grade 4 or 5 and having below average conformation and cut ability. USDA Select+ or lower quality grade and under finished animals that are average or below average in conformation.

Danish System of Judging

After weighing, market lambs will be divided into weight lots for convenience in judging.

NOTE: Market sheep are wethers and ewes only.

JUDGING SCALE: No more than 1-inch wool on animals. Should be slick shorn prior to being weighed. All lambs will be checked off the trailers for compliance of teeth, wool fungus, sore mouth and tail docking rule according to California Divisions of Fairs and Expositions State Rules.

GRADE:

Market Ready: USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12th rib back fat range .16-.35, average or greater conformation and cut ability.

Not Market Ready: Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range <.16 or >.35; under-finished lambs grading USDA good or lower, below-average conformation or cut ability.

Group 3: Animals with the potential to grade good, with average conformation.

Group 4: Animals with the potential to grade medium, with below-average conformation.
