Please refer to General Rules and applicable Small stock rules pertaining to this department before making entry. Read all rules-carefully. Failure to recognize will exclude entry.

SPECIAL RULES:

1. Limit of Entries: There is no limit of Entries, however please be reminded that Rule IV of the State Rule prevails. Jr. division is open to exhibitors 5 THROUGH 18 YEARS OF AGE.
2. Entries must be made on Official Entry forms. Please use separate and appropriate forms for each division. (Open Pigeons, Junior Pigeons ect.) Entry forms may be photocopied.
3. Entry Forms must be legible, please type or print form. Make a copy of your entry, keep it keep it and use it when you deliver or pick up entries. ENTRY FORMS MUST SHOW BREED, VARIETY, AGE, SEX, BAND NUMBER, DIVISION, CLASS, SOCIAL SECURITY AND SIGNATURE OF EXHIBITOR.
4. Entry Fee \$2.00 per bird. Every fee must be sent with entry form. Should an entry be made and concealed or not exhibited, entry fees will not be refunded. Over payment of entry fees will not be refunded. A penalty of \$25.00 must be paid if an entry fee check is refused by the bank.
5. DECISIONS AND APPEALS: Competent judges have been employed and their decisions are final. The management reserve the right to make changes in judging assignment when necessary EXHIBITORS OR THEIR AGENTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO CONVERSE WITH JUDGES WHILE AWARDS ARE BEING MADE.
6. DISPLAY OF EXHIBITS: Exhibitors will be judged and on display during the duration of the Show. No exhibitor will be released prior to the time specified. Except sick birds which will be released with permission from show management and removed immediately from the fairgrounds by the exhibitor. Positively no exceptions.
7. LEG BANDS: This show is conducted under rules that recognize all seamless bands of reputable banding organizations. All birds must wear a numbered leg band corresponding with the number given on the entry form. Young birds compete on a fair basis for the premiums offered. Birds will not be accepted unless properly banded.
8. SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions may be made ONLY in the same CLASS, SEX, and Variety.
9. DISQUALIFICATION: The right is reserved to Disqualify. All unworthy specimens. Each specimen must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor an shown in its natural condition.
10. A RELEASE FORM MUST BE OBTAINED FROM SMALL STOCK OFFICE BEFORE BIRDS ARE RELEASED, ALL BIRDS MUST BE PICKED UP BEFORE 10:00 p.m. OR THEY BECOME PROPERTY OF THE FARMERS FAIR & FESTIVAL UNLESS OTHER ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE.
11. All eggs laid during the show will be destroyed.
12. Exhibitors desiring to sell birds are responsible for their own sales. No "FOR SALE" signs will be allowed on cages, except business cards may be placed on cage's after the judging has been completed.
13. DELIVERY CRATES: All crates must be removed from the show area as soon as birds are transferred to show cages.
Exhibitors of rollers: you must show on entry form if the birds are flying or show.
